NWT Resident Harvest

Current Resident Regulations:

- Require hunting licence
- Maximum of 2 bull tags per year
- Season 15 Aug to 30 April
- G/BC/01, G/BC/03 & I/BC/05 only areas in Beaufort Delta region where residents can harvest barren-ground caribou
 - Only other Area open in NWT is U/BC/01 (Beverly Herd)



NWT Resident Harvest

Harvest Data based on:

- Licensing system record of hunters/tags sold
- Mail-in (3 wave) resident survey (21/22 still in progress 3 wave mail out)

NWT Resident Harvest

- Maximum harvest assumes all unreported tags were used
- ENR working on increasing reporting rates did pilot project on online reporting
- Recommendation to PCMB for mandatory reporting
- Due to closures of other areas in NWT, need to continue to look at data from other regions as well, since NWT residents from other regions can travel to G/BC/01, G/BC/03 and I/BC/05 to harvest

- Caribou present near Aklavik this year and regular patrols are being done




Body Condition Samples

- NWT: hunters collect samples
- PCTC reported the data
- 195 sample kits collected in 20/21 season
- No sample kits collected in 21/22 season




Habitat

- 14 fires in 2022 in Beaufort Delta
 - A few tundra fires in Richardson Mountains



Habitat

Snow depth station data collected annually at 5 sites along the Dempster - The 2021/2022 snowpack on the Dempster highway was about average around Inuvik and increased to well above average near the NWT-YT border





ENR Plans to:

- Continue work with co-management partners and other Parties to implement the HMP
- Continue to work, with co-management partners, to help address compliance issues of the commercial sale of wildlife meat
- Support PCMB as lead in development of a comprehensive herd management plan



ENR Plans to:

- Work with partners to improve harvest data collection
- Continue hunter education work building on messages
 - Maximize bull harvest in the fall
 - Report harvest data
 - Sight in your rifle and retrieve wounded animals
