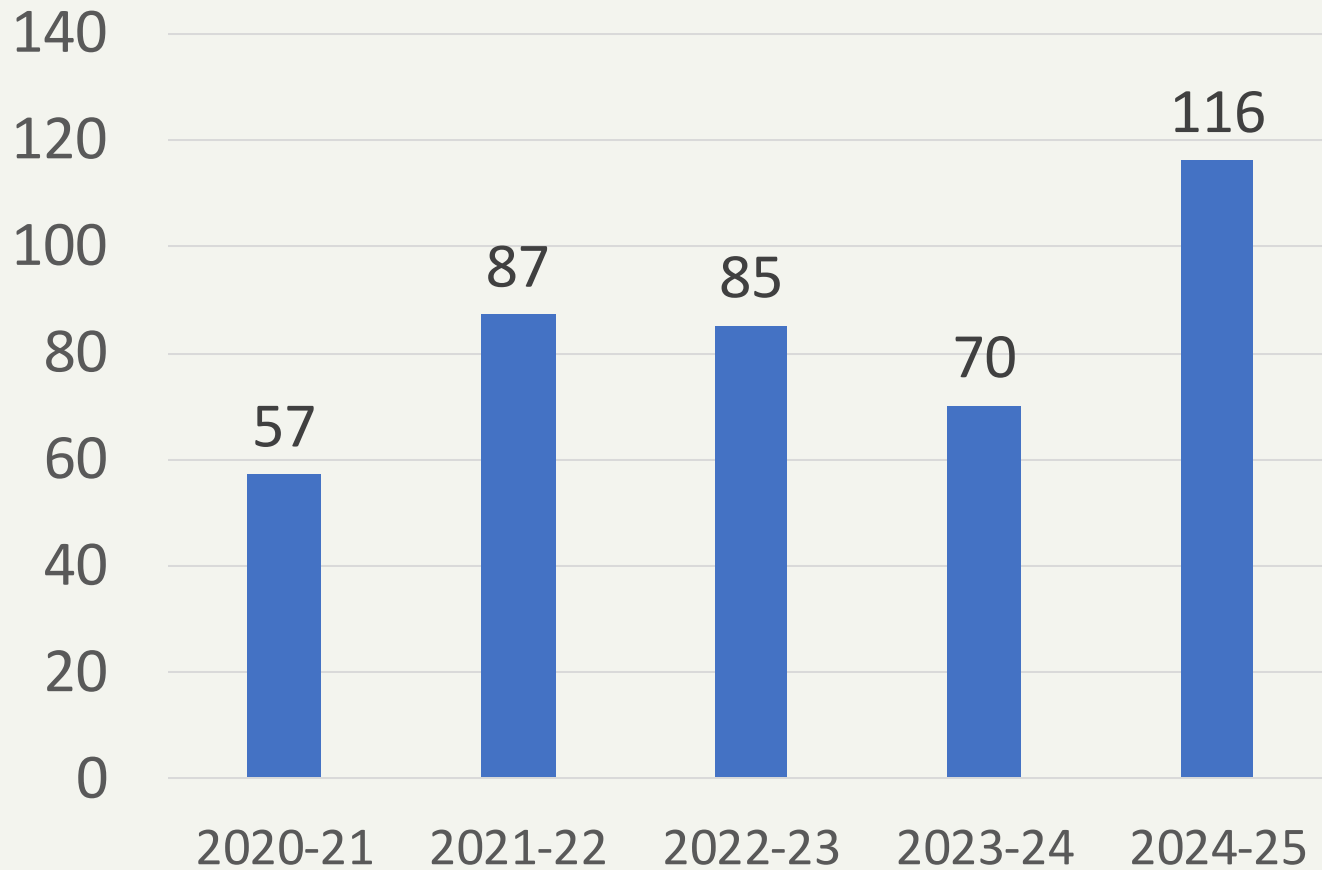

VGFN harvest survey participation by year

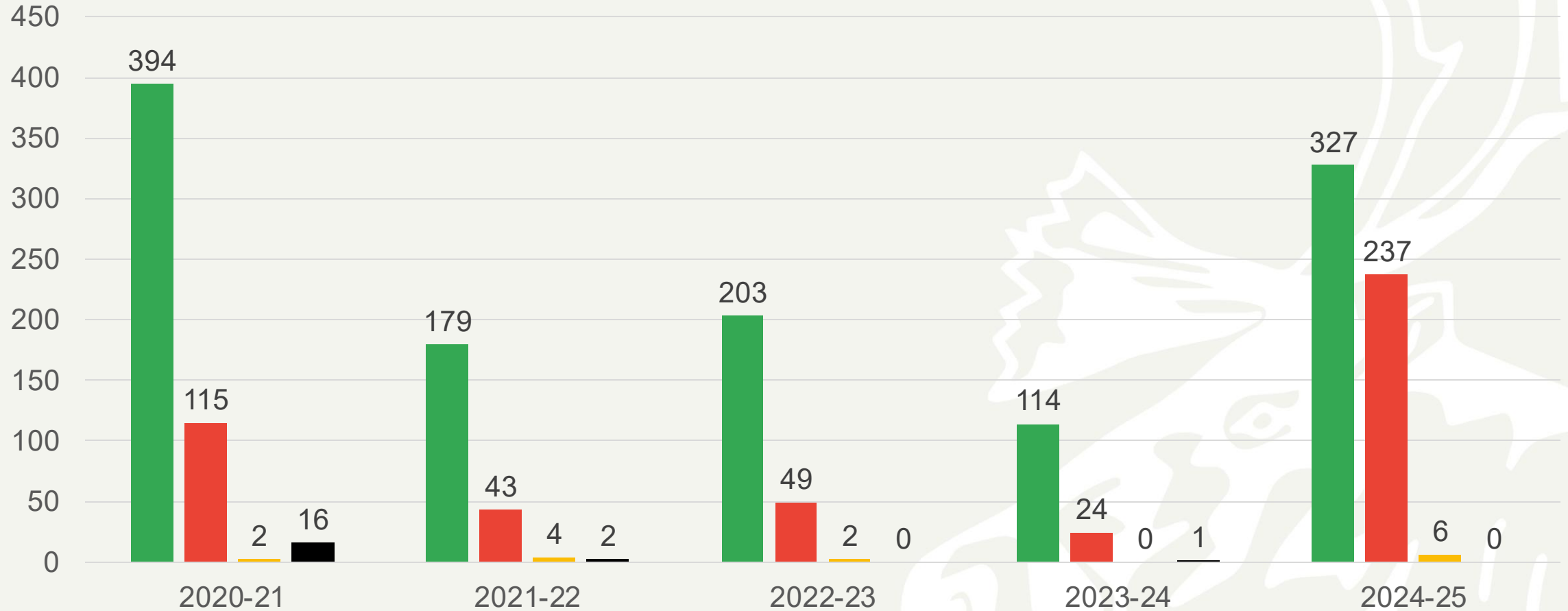


- Using a census approach, we try to get surveys from every active VGFN harvester

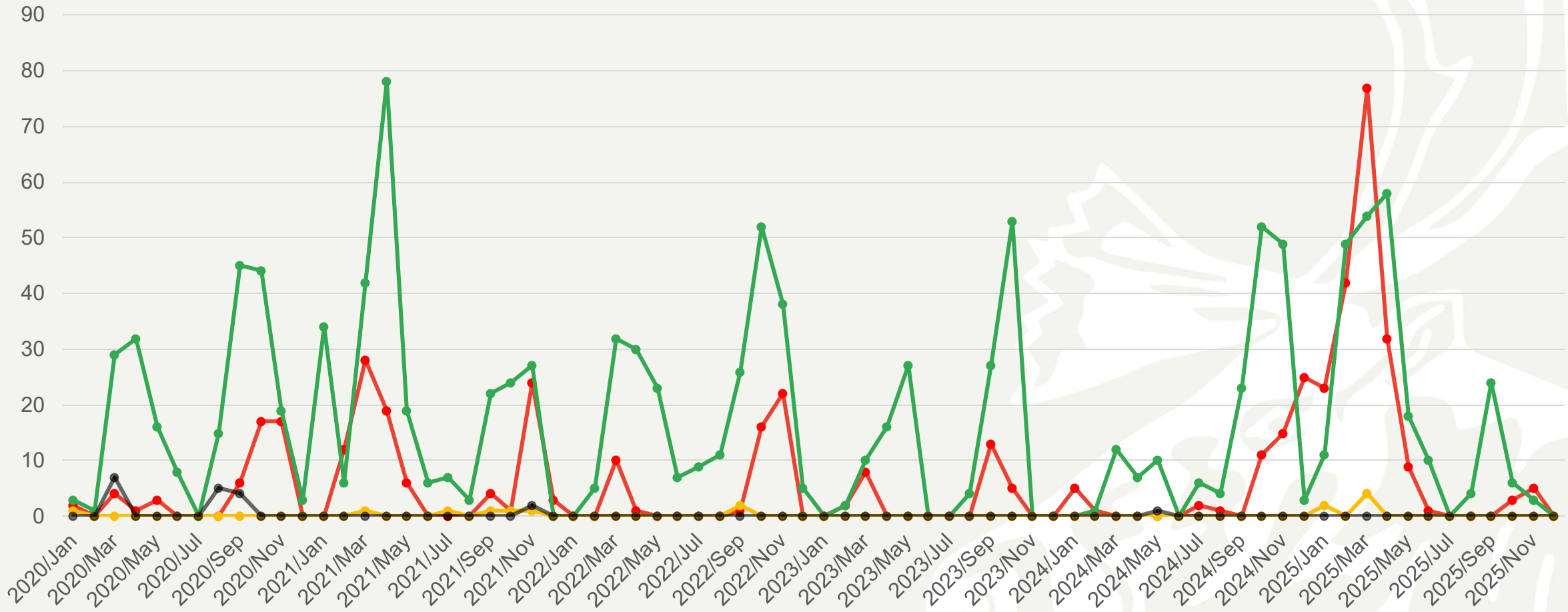
VGFN harvest by year

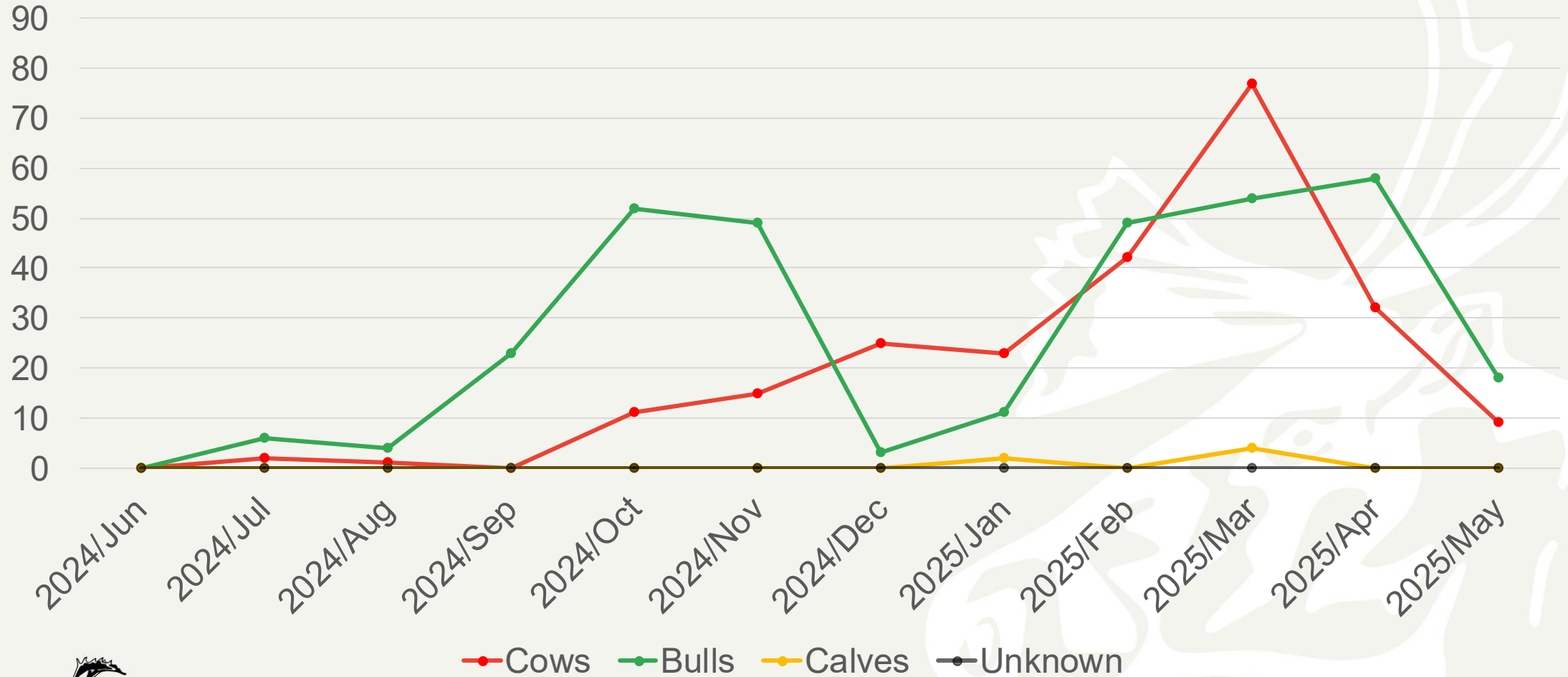
VGFN harvest by month

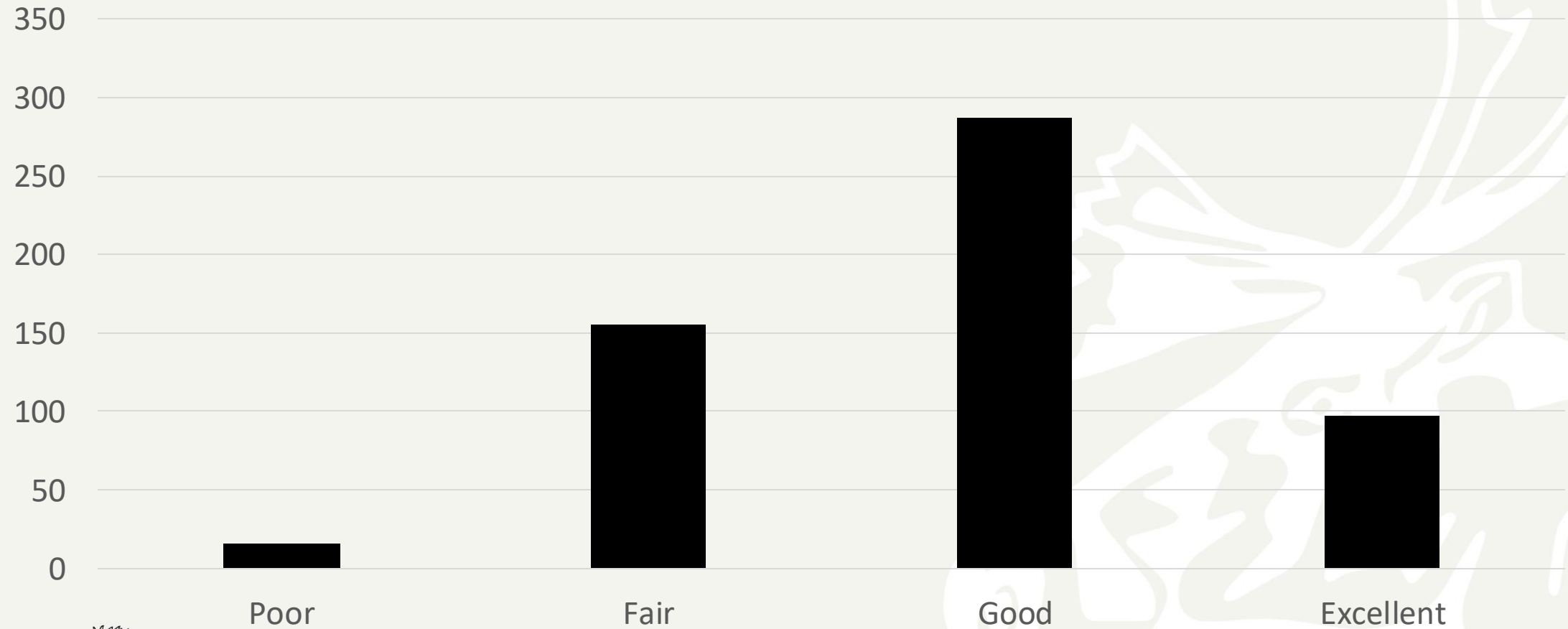

VGFN harvest by month 2024-25



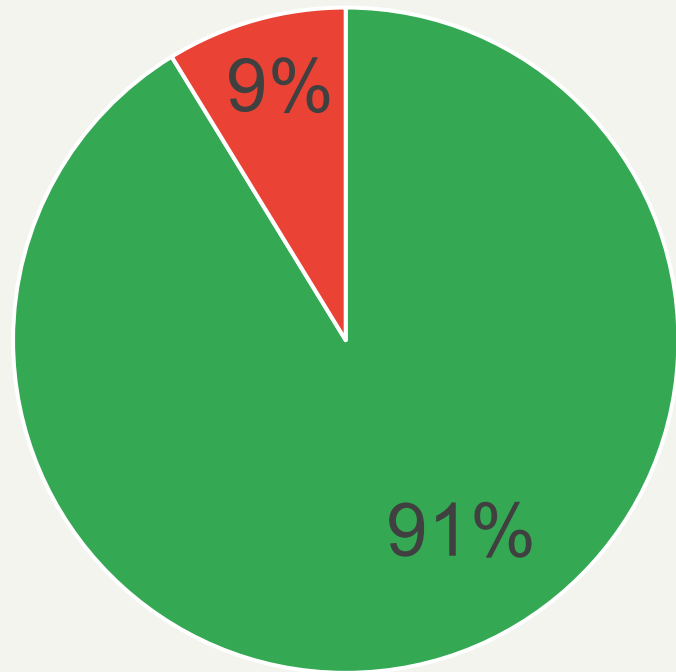
